Contextualització

This course is meant to examine how we use language to communicate. The course includes the study of linguistic forms as well as a consideration of the general principles of interpretation by which people normally make sense of what they hear and read. Students will be familiar with the present state of research in the fields of pragmatics and discourse analysis calling on insights from different inter-disciplinary areas. They will also be able to apply these theories to the analysis of spoken and written English discourse. All the theoretical sessions will be accompanied by various practice tasks in order to enhance the learning process.

Although this course has no official requirements, students are recommended to have an advanced level of English proficiency (C1), as described by the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages. Students with a lower level of proficiency may be penalized if their use of English is not adequate.

Metodologia docent

This course will offer **one single assessment pathway**:

The course will be organised as follows:



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1) Theory classes (large group), devoted mainly to the theoretical study of the most complex points included in the syllabus, although the sessions may include some practice tasks.

2) Seminars, designed to complement theory classes and provide students with more practice sessions. Some short readings and new topics, as well as reinforcement and fuller treatment of class topics will be provided. Students will have to do required readings, which will be announced throughout the course, before the in-class sessions. Note that practice and theory may be present in both types of sessions (i.e. Theory classes and seminars).

Important notes:

* Mobile phones and other electronic devices are NOT allowed in the classroom. Laptop computers are acceptable ONLY if used for purposes related to classroom activity. No electronic device whatsoever (including computers) is allowed in the classroom during exams/practical sessions, unless otherwise specified by the lecturer (e.g., if the practical session entails use of the Internet for pedagogical purposes).

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Riscs específics i mesures de protecció

Les activitats d'aprenentatge d'aquesta assignatura no comporten riscs específics per a la seguretat i salut dels alumnes i, per tant, no cal adoptar mesures de protecció especials.

Avaluació de l'aprenentatge dels estudiants

This course offers one single assessment pathway or itinerary, which consists of: 1) a mid-term exam (45% of the final grade), 2) an end-of-the semester test (45% of the final grade), and 3) Participation in class and the oral presentation of a research project (group or individual), planned with the lecturer's guidance (up to 10% of the final grade). Final mark: $1+2+3 = 100\%$. ** Note that serious lexico-grammatical mistakes will be penalised and may automatically result in a fail grade.

Note that the minimum mark required for a part to be computed is 5/10. It is a requirement for this course that in order to receive a positive evaluation, students need to **pass the two exams** (mid-term test and end-of-the-semester test) and **do the oral presentation**. **Only those students who have done the oral presentation will be allowed to take the end-of-semester test.** If a student fails to do so, they will not be able to resit the two course exams in the **February evaluation** ('Convocatoria Extraordinaria'). If a student does not pass the two exams in the January Examination ('Convocatoria Ordinaria'), the grades for the oral presentation will be carried forward to the February examination ('Convocatoria Extraordinaria').

The date (and time) when oral presentations will be due will be duly announced. No extensions whatsoever will be given.

Part-time students:

Students officially recognised by the UIB as part-time students will follow Pathway B. In this case, students are not expected to regularly attend or actively participate in sessions. Those interested in this assessment option will need to present the lecturer with a formal application in the first two weeks of the term. This application will include documentary evidence proving that they find themselves in one of the following situations:
a) Estar treballant amb una mitjana de dedicació equivalent, com a mínim, a la meitat de la durada màxima de jornada ordinària de treball. Això s'ha d'acreditar amb un contracte de treball en vigor o un nomenament administratiu; alternativament es poden aportar altres documents que provin l'activitat actual, com els justificant de cotització en qualsevol règim de la Seguretat Social.

b) Estar afectat per una discapacitat física, sensorial o psíquica, en un grau igual o superior al 33 per cent, que és el que estableix la normativa que regula la reserva de places per a l'accés a la Universitat d'estudiants amb necessitats educatives especials. El grau de discapacitat s'ha d'acreditar mitjançant el certificat emès per l'organisme competent per al seu reconeixement.

c) Tenir 45 anys o més en la data d'inici del curs acadèmic.

d) Estar en situació de protecció a la família o haver de tenir cura de persones dependents.

e) Trobar-se en altres situacions extraordinàries que l'òrgan competent valori com a determinants per ser incorporat a la situació de dedicació a l'estudi a temps parcial.

The Vice-Dean for English Studies will consider all applications and decide whether applicants should be granted part-time student status. Upon notification, Pathway B students will be asked to sign a learning agreement (available from Campus Extens).

Important notes:



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*If a student fails to hand in an assignment or to show up on the day and at the time established by the lecturer for the exams/practical sessions, the grade for that assignment/exam/practical session will be 0 (zero), in case the student has presented more than 30% of the total assigned evaluation course tasks. Only if the student has presented 30% or less than 30% of the total assigned evaluation course tasks, will the grade be 'NP'.

Under no circumstances will the dates and times of the official exams be altered, with the only exception of those cases contemplated by the Reglament Acadèmic, namely: (1) When the time between the end of one exam and the start of another is under 3 hours; (2) Hospitalisation; death of a close relative; compulsory public duties; sports competitions in the case of high-performance athletes; (3) In the specific case of incoming or outgoing exchange students, when there is conflict between the UIB's assessment calendar and the student's home or host institution (evidence of which must be duly provided).

Students will not be allowed into the classroom once the exam/ practical session has already started.

* It should be noted that plagiarism will always be penalised, in accordance with the UIB's current academic regulations (Reglament Acadèmic), reproduced below:

Criteris d'avaluació	A mid-term test (45% of the final grade), in which students will be assessed on the topics covered in the first part of the course. The mid-term test is considered to be final for those students who obtain pass marks (5/10 or above), and therefore they will only have to sit the exam for the second part of the course (end-of-semester test- 45% of the final grade). On the contrary, those students who fail the mid-term test will have to resit this exam on the official date established by the UIB in February ('Convocatoria Extraordinaria').
